and said that, if those two canals were widened and deepened, it would be affording a permanent protection to the wet lands. He therefore requested that the work might be ordered to be taken up and completed at an early date.

The Member also requested that a proper road should be constructed so as to connect Kottayam with Vetchur, either through Kumarakom or through Olesha and Parippu, and also three bridges on the road from Vycome to Vetchur. The bridges were required over the Maramvettil Thodu, the Vellayil Thodu and the Anchumuna Thodu.

Dewan's reply.—Noted.

73. *Opening of a canal near the Lekshmi-puram Market.*

Mr. Konakku Narayanan Kesavan (Member, Kottayam Taluk) said that the Lekshmi-puram Market, opened five or six years ago, was decreasing in importance on account of the absence of proper roads and canals in the vicinity. In view to develop the market, he requested that a canal be opened near the market, connecting the *pincha* lands in the eastern and western parts of the Nattagom Proverthy.

Dewan's reply.—Noted.

74. *Widening of the canal from Kollappalli Padom to Parakal Kadavu.*

Mr. Parameswaran Iravi (Member, Changanacherry Taluk) said that about 30,000 paras of paddy lands in the taluk depended for water upon a small canal, about 12 miles long, running through the midst of these lands from Kollappalli Padom in the Kurumbaredam Kara in the Changanacherry taluk to the Parakal Kadavu in the Nattagom Proverthy in the Kottayam taluk. The canal was in many places narrow, silted up and shallow. Six canals from the Changanacherry taluk and seven canals from the Kottayam taluk entered this canal as tributaries. The canal in question being very narrow, the large volume of water that found its way into the canal overflowed both the banks, and much damage was caused to the cultivated lands on either side, to the great hardship of the ryots. The Member said that the improvement of this canal was one of the eleven works (No. 5) recommended by the Members of the Kottayam Division at the Fifth Assembly, and it was thus engaging the attention of the Government. He requested that the canal might be extended by another three miles and the work expedited, as the canal, if improved, would be of great use not only to agriculture, but also to trade and communication, and also for bathing and drinking purposes.

Dewan's reply.—Noted.

75. *Means of communication in the Meenachil taluk.*
