The Travancore-Cochin Legislative Assembly met for the first time after the inauguration of the Republic of India, in the Legislative Chamber, Trivandrum at 11 of the Clock on Monday, the 6th March 1950 with Mr. Speaker in the Chair.

അജന്റാ അനുസരിച്ച് ഇന്നു രാവിലെ നടക്കേണ്ട കൃത്വം ഭരണഘടനയിലെ മുവ്യാ-ാം വകുപ്പിൽ ആവശ്വപ്പെട്ടിട്ടുള്ള പ്രകാരം രാജപ്രമുഖൻറയോ, അഥവാ അദ്ദേഹം നിയമിക്കുന്ന ഒരാളുടേയോ മുമ്പാകെ ബഹുമാനപ്പെട്ട അംഗങ്ങറം സത്വപ്രതിജ്ഞയോ, ദുഢ പ്രതിജ്ഞയോ ചെയ്യുക എന്നുള്ള മാത്രമാണും. രാജപ്രമുഖൻ തിരുമനസ്സുകൊണ്ടും എന്നെ അതിലേക്ക് നിയമിച്ചിരിക്കുന്നം. സെക്രട്ടറി ആദ്യമായി യഥാക്രമം ബഹുമാനപ്പെട്ട ഡെ പുട്ടി സ്വീക്കറേയും ബഹുമാനാപ്പെട്ട പ്രധാന മന്ത്രിയേയും മറ്റ് മന്ത്രിമാരേയും പിന്നീടു അ ക്ഷരമാലക്രമമനസരിച്ചും മറ്റു ബഹുമാനപ്പെട്ട അംഗങ്ങളേയും സത്വപ്രതിജ്ഞയോ, ദുഢ വേദിയുടെ മുമ്പിലുള്ള മേശക്കരുകിൽ വന്നു സത്വപ്രതിജ്ഞ നടത്തിയതിനുശേഷം രജിസ്റ്റ രിൽ ഒപ്പുവയ്ക്കുകയും സ്ഥാനങ്ങറും സ്വീകരിക്കുന്നതിനുമുന്നും അദ്ധ്വക്ഷനമായി അഭിവാദനം നടത്തുകയും ചെയ്യേണ്ടതാണും.

അജൻറായിൽ പറഞ്ഞിട്ടുള്ളതുപോലെ, രാജപ്രമുഖൻ തിരുമനസ്സുകൊണ്ട് ഇന്നു സായാഹാം ൪ മണിക്കും സഭയെ സംബോധന ചെയ്യന്നതാണും. പ്രസ്തത് പ്രസംഗത്തിന്മേ ലുള്ള വാദപ്രതിവാദം മാർച്ചും വുംം തീയതി ബുധനാഴ്ച നടക്കുന്നതായിരിക്കും. ഇതു സംബന്ധിച്ചുള്ള സംഗതങ്ങളായ നടപടിച്ചുട്ടത്മാം, അസംബ്ലിയുടെ പരിഷ്കരിച്ച ചുട്ടങ്ങളി ലം സ്കാൻറിംഗ് ആർഡറുകളിലും അടങ്ങിയിരിക്കുന്നു. അവയുടെ പ്രതികഠം ബഹുമാനപ്പെട്ട അംഗങ്ങഠംകും ഇതിനകം ലഭിച്ചിട്ടുണ്ടല്ലോ. രാജപ്രമഖൻ തിരുമനസ്സുകൊണ്ടു സമയെ സംബോധനചെയ്യുന്നതു" ഇടംപ്രഥമമായിട്ടാണെന്നു" ബഹുമാനപ്പെട്ട അംഗങ്ങ് കെറിയാ മല്ലോം അതിനാശേഷം പ്രസംഗത്തെ അധികരിച്ചു ഒരു വാദപ്രതിവാദം ഉണ്ടായിരിക്കും. ഞ ഇസംബന്ധിച്ച് അവലംബിക്കേണ്ട നടപടിക്രമത്തെക്കുറിച്ച് സംക്ഷേപമായി സൂചിപ്പി ക്കാൻ ഞാൻ **ആഗ്രഹിക്കുന്നു. സാ**ലാരണ പാർലമെൻററി സംപ്രദായത്തിനനത്രപമായി ചർച്ചയ്ക്ക് രണ്ടുഭാഗം ഉണ്ടായിരിക്കും. ആദ്വഭാഗം, പ്രസംഗത്തിൽ പ്രതിപാദിച്ചിട്ടുള്ള ഗവ മെമ്റിൻെറ്റ് പൊതുനയത്തെ പ്രാറിയുള്ള നിരുപണത്തിനമാത്രവും രണ്ടാമത്തെ ഭാഗം എത ജ്ഞതാപ്രമേയത്തിനുള്ള ഭേദഗതികളുടെ പര്വാലോചനസംബന്ധിച്ചം ആയിരിക്കുന്നതാ അത്തരം ഭേദഗതികഠം സാധാരണയായി പ്രതിപക്ഷത്തുനിന്നാണ് അവതരിപ്പിക്കാ <u>രള്ളൂം. മാർച്ചും വൂ-ാം തിയതിയിലെ പ്രസംഗത്തിന്മേലുള്ള വാദപ്രതിവാദത്തെ സംബ</u> ന്ധിച്ചിടത്തോളം പ്രധാന പ്രമേയവും അതിനു ഭേഭഗതികളണ്ടെങ്കിൽ അവയും ഒരുമിച്ച ചർച്ച ചെയ്യാവുന്നതാണം" അതായതും ജൂദ്വമായി രാജപ്രമഖൻ തിരുമുനസ്സിനോടും കൃത ജ്ഞത പ്രദശിപ്പിച്ചുകൊണ്ടുള്ള പ്രമേയവം പിന്നീട്ട് ഭേദഗതികളം അവതരിപ്പിക്കുന്നതും അതിനുശേഷം രണ്ടിന്മേലും ചർച്ച നടത്താവന്നതം ആകുന്ന

ADDRESS BY HIS HIGHNESS THE RAJPRAMUKH

His Highness the Rajpramukh having arrived in the chamber in procession with the Speaker, Deputy Speaker and the Secretary to the Legislative Assembly, occupied the Speaker's Chair on the Dais at Four of the clock. The Speaker was seated to the left of His Highness.

His Highness the Rajpramukh: Hon'ble Members of the Legislature, It is a matter of sincere pleasure to me today to welcome you all to the first meeting of this legislature after the inauguration of the Republic of India.

We are meeting at a most important and historic juncture in India's political emancipation. After years of travail, India has emerged as a Sovereign Democratic Republic and a fresh epoch has commenced in her history. Under the able guidance of veteran leaders at the head of affairs, she can now march forward to take her rightful place in the Comity of Nations.

The goodwill and peace which marked the transfer of authority by the British Government are without parallel in the history of the world and it will be appropriate on our part to acknowledge our deep debt of gratitude to the great nation for the consummation of this unique event.

Though the struggle for political freedom is over, the battle against poverty, disease, ignorance, squalor and unemployment yet remain to be fought. To the vast majority of the people: freedom will mean nothing unless it ushers in an era of economic security and freedom from want. Our first concern should, therefore, be to work for the welfare of the eight millions of fellow beings of this State whose destinies are placed in our hands. We have also to educate the large numbers of voters in the proper exercise of their franchise for the election of their representatives, without which the successful working of democracy will be impossible. My Government are already going ahead with the arrangements for the holding of the first general election under the new Constitution well in time.

The legislative programme for the present Session of the Assembly consists in the introduction and consideration of the Hindu Religious Institutions Bill, the Agricultural Income Tax Bill, the Holdings (Stay of Execution Proceedings) Bill, the Industrial Disputes Bill and the Travancore Succession Certificate Act (Amendment) Bill. It is also proposed to take up for Second Reading the Public Safety Measures Bill, the Board of Revenue Bill, the Cochin Temple Entry Authorisation Proclamation (Amendment) Bill, the Prohibition Bill, the Vehicles Taxation Bill, the Prisons Bill, the Prisoners Bill, the Identification of Prisoners Bill, the Removal of Civil Disabilities Bill, the Civil Courts Bill, the Prevention of Corruption Bill, and the Drugs Control Bill. The Debt Relief Act, II of 1116 (Travancore) (Amendment) Bill will also be taken up as a Non-Official Bill during this Session of the Assembly.

is the federal financial integration. This means that sources of revenue which are federal in character will pass to the Central Government. The surrender of these sources, which we have been enjoying till now, will result in a net loss of considerable magnitude to our Government. To meet the financial dislocation caused by this gap in our revenues, the Central Government have guaranteed the following assistance for the next ten years. From the date of federal financial integration up to 31st March 1955 the entire residual net revenue gap of Travancore-Cochin taken together is guaranteed. In respect of the three years 1950-1951 to 1952-1953 the amount guaranteed is the entire federal revenues of Travancore-Cochin for the year 1124 M. E. For the next two years viz., 1953-1954 and 1954-1955 we are guaranteed the average of the federal revenues for the years 1123-1124 M. E. From 1st April 1955 to 31st March 1960 the residual net revenue gap to be reimbursed by the Centre will be gradually reduced by a tapering arrangement, working down finally to 60 per cent of the net revenue gap in 1960.

The scheme of federal financial integration involves not merely the taking over the federal revenue by the Centre but also the assumption of all expenditure in the State on Services of a "federal" character. For administrative reasons the State may have to continue to administer some of the federal services, like Anchal, on an agency basis, even after the financial integration.

From the date of federal financial integration, the Government will become entitled to receive enhanced food subsidy from the Centre equal to 75 per cent of our loss on food transactions as in the case of the former Provinces. We will also become eligible for grants-in-aid subsidies and other forms of financial and technical assistance from the Centre, independently of the scheme of transitional adjustments.

4. Our State is one of the most highly deficit areas in food and depends on imports for over half of its food requirements. By reason of vast areas covered by mountains and lakes, the scope for rapidly increasing food production is limited. Despite the natural handicaps, my Government are making vigorous endeavours to make the Grow More Food Campaign effective by bringing fallow lands under the plough and by increasing the yield from the exisiting cultivated areas. In the matter of food production, the Departments of Agriculture, Electricity and Public Works were till recently working independently of one another. It has to be noticed that substantial efforts have been made in the past by the Travancore and Cochin Governments towards extensive and intensive cultivation and if those efforts have not borne fruit to the extent desired the reason was not the inadequacy or slackness of efforts but the absence of a steady, definite and long range programme. This is a problem which has to be viewed not against the special conditions of any particular season or the situation in any one locality but in the light of the varying conditions in different parts of the State and over a sufficiently long period of time. The programme has to be so arranged as to yield the maximum benefit in the quickest time possible and to wring out the best results from every penny spent and every effort expended.

With these ideas in view, my Government have constituted a Food Production Board and the programme undertaken by my Government on the advice of the Board covers the period till the end of 1951 providing for an economic utilisation of our resources and for the maximisation of results. The intention is to adhere to this programme strictly and the expectation is that our deficit would consequently be reduced to a substantial extent. Complete self-sufficiency, however, in the matter of food supplies is for us more or less impossible in the present circumstances. Extension of lift irrigation, reclamation of grass lands, sale of manure at subsidised rates, backwater reclamation, sinking of wells, renovation of tanks and supply of pump sets are the more important of the measures adopted to step up food production. These measures will be intensified during the next year. Major irrigation schemes like the Peechi, Chalakudi and Perinchani Irrigation Schemes will also be speeded up.

- 5. As you are aware, there is a wide disparity in the rates of land tax in the Travancore and Cockin areas. My Government have constituted a Committee to examine the question of the future land policy to be adopted in the State and to suggest appropriate reforms.
- The health of the people of a country ought to be one of the first responsibilities of any civilised administration. Consistent with their financial resources, my Government have been taking steps to protect the health of the people, prevent the occurrence of epidemics and provide for adequate medical relief. The paucity of qualified medical men in the State and the difficulty experienced by the State subjects in gaining admission in Medical Colleges outside the State prompted my Government to establish a Medical College of their own. In the budget for the next year, adequate provision will be made for this purpose and also for providing better amenities in medical institutions, for raising the scale of diet to patients and for improving sanitation. Special attention will also be devoted to the prevention and treatment of tuberculosis, which claims a toll of millions every year. The regeneration of the rural areas and the improvement of the economic conditions of the rural population have been engaging the attention of the Travancore and Cochin Governments for some years now. The implementation of the Panchayat Act should mark an important stage in the development of the corporate life of our villagers and rural population. The democratic basis of these bodies, their composition and their functioning and the wide range of powers, duties and responsibilities devolving on these self-governing institutions should make them not only the nurseries of our democracy but also the instrument for the regeneration of our villages and rural economy. It is proposed to incur larger expenditure on improvement of village communications, construction of new roads and bridges, sinking of wells, development of cottage industries and other measures for the improvement of rural life. My Government are convinced that one of the crying needs of areas along the coastal tracts is the provision of good drinking water. A scheme for the construction of an adequate number of tube wells to meet this need, especially along the coastal areas, is being undertaken by my Government. Likewise, the question of providing housing-facilities in areas where industrial labour is clustered together in insanitary conditions has also been engaging the attention of my Government. The provision made in the last year's budget for the launching of a house-construction scheme for industrial and agricultural labour in the various parts of the State has been pushed through, and it is expected that by the end of next year we should have launched upon the second stage of this scheme.

Special attention has been devoted by my Government to ensure healthy relations between labour and employer and to see that the disputes arising between them are settled quickly and to their mutual satisfaction. The Industrial Disputes Act has been extended to the Plantation Labour also and the settlement of the disputes by the three Industrial Tribunals working in the State has been satisfactory. It is hoped that the continued functioning of these Tribunals will not only eliminate occasions for friction between labour and capital but also result in standardising, to the extent possible, the conditions of labour, the rates of wages, the percentage of bonus and other matters of frequent friction.

My Government are also unremitting in their policy of amelioration of Harijans and other backward communities.

The Co-operative movement has come to play an important part in developing public economy. My Government have been closely nursing the Co-operative institutions in the State and affording them technical advice and financial assistance to the extent possible. It is intended that cottage industries should get a fillip shortly when they are reorganised under Co-operative auspices.

It is a matter of just pride to us that in the field of education our State is well ahead of other units in India. We are already spending a large proportion of our revenues on education but my Government are aware that there is a growing volume of opinion that the conditions of service of the teachers in the Primary and Secondary Schools need betterment. The extent to which the finances of the State will permit such betterment, is under the active consideration of my Government.

My Government realise that with the recession in trade there has been a reduction in the volume of employment. This situation can be met only by reorganising trades and more especially by undertaking nation-building activities and new industries. It should be remembered that in the matter of industrial development we are constitutionally unable to pursue any policy unrelated to the policy and programme of the Central Government. The constitution of a Planning Committee at the Centre is certainly an important move and it is to be confidently hoped that the recommendations of the Committee will take into account the special features, resources and possibilities available in this Unit and afford a fillip for the development of local industries as an essential link in the chain of India's industrial progress. Apart from the heavy and key industries of national importance to which the above observations mainly apply, we have got our small scale and indigenous cottage industries the prosperity of which is essential for the maintenance of our village economy. My Government propose to undertake the revival of these cottage industries on a definite plan so as to link it as far as possible with the general industrial planning on an all-India basis. Subject to these considerations and the over-riding consideration of finance, many new nation-building activities are contemplated. These include multipurpose dams, roads, co-operative farming, housing schemes and the like. In the matter of communications the most important step proposed to be taken is the improvement of the main central road on a uniform standard from Cape Comorin to Shoranur. The portion from the Cape to Trivandrum was concreted and rendered dustless several years ago and the remaining portion also has to be similarly finished and my Government hope it will be possible to do it on a programme spread over five to six years.

7. Even after the integration of the two States of Travancore and Cochin the officials continue to draw the same scales of pay which they were doing in the respective States. The disparity between the scales thus brought about is sought to be removed as early as possible by unification of the scales of pay.

Finally my Government would like to pay a tribute to the police force in the State which is continuing to function efficiently in maintaining law and order and in combating subversive activities. I should also take this opportunity to acknowledge the debt we owe to the State Forces who during the past centuries of service with us have maintained the highest traditions of the State and the Army.

8. You will shortly have an opportunity to examine the financial and other activities of my Government when the Budget for the coming year is presented. Knowing, as I do, the past traditions of this House, I am confident that in examining them you will be guided by the same high sense of duty, responsibility and impartiality as in the past.
