Abstract Proceedings of the Travancore
Legislative Council assembled under the
provisions of Regulation III of 1862.

The Council met at the Dewan's room,
Near Public Office, at 12 Noon on Tuesday
the 26 February 1874 and adjourned at 3 P.M.
on Saturday the 2 March 1874.

On the first day the Hon. Mr. Changanassery
introduced the Bill and
explained the necessity for a revision of the
draft submitted by the High Court before the
Council was established. He explained the
various amendments proposed by him
and the necessity for a revision of the
draft.

The Bill was referred for report to a select committee composed of the members
 Mr. K. K. V. Pothappa Nair, Kozhikode
 Mr. K. K. S. Rajaman, Kozhikode
 Mr. K. K. S. Thambi Pillay, Kozhikode
 Mr. K. K. N. Vedarajadasa Pillay, Kozhikode and
 the mover.

It was also ordered to be published.
 Mr. K. K. S. Rajaman, Kozhikode similarly
 introduced the Bill amending the Code of
 Criminal Procedure.

It was referred for report to a Select
 Committee composed of
 Mr. K. K. S. Thungarathobor, Kozhikode
 Mr. S. V. V. V.

 and the mover.

The publication of the Bill was suspended
 till the receipt of the select committee's report.
 Mr. K. K. S. Thambi Pillay, Kozhikode having at
 the meeting of the 25th February obtained permission

to introduce a Bill to regulate the 'Ningal'
 Service, did so at the meeting of the 25th Feb.
 He urged that a definite law has now be-
 come imperative owing to the introduction of
 'Ningal' Stamp.

Resolved that the Bill be first published and that it be taken into consideration at the next Session.

Mr. R. P. A. Shungralobor Aye Aye introduced a Bill for the reconstitution of the High Court, having obtained permission to do so at the meeting of the 26 February.

After some discussion on the question of reducing the number of judges from five to four and of limiting the number of appeals to one regular appeal from the judgments of the Panchayat Courts, it was resolved to publish the Bill and to take it into consideration again at the next Session.
