

# Abstract Proceedings of the Travancore Legislative Council.

"6" March 1891.

The Council resolved its meeting,

Present

M.R.R. Shringarachari Averal presiding.

Mr. F. Watts M.A.

M.R.R. Rajaram Row Averal.

M.R.R. Shanmukh Pillai Simple.

M.R.R. K. Neelakunda Pillai Simple.

M.R.R. Seenu Pillai Averal.

It was resolved that section 342  
should stand over for consideration.

M.R.R. Rajaram Row Averal  
proposed a new section 341A as follows:-

"The Special Appellate Judge appointed  
under Our Proclamation dated 22<sup>nd</sup> January 1851  
6<sup>th</sup> November 1875  
shall hear and dispose of appeals from the decision  
of our special magistrates and shall review their  
Proceedings."

Carried.

The question of bringing in the  
privileges of Residents, attachies and military sepoys  
of the British into the Code was brought up by  
M.R.R. Rajaram Row Averal and discussed.  
Resolved that it was not necessary to provide  
for it in the Code.

Mr. Watts moved to omit the  
Select Committee's addition to the definition  
of pleader.  
It was carried.

M.R.R. Rajaram Row Averal  
proposed to amend the section 46 by defining  
summons case as meaning a case relating to  
an offence punishable with fine only in the prison.

ment not exceeding six months or with both  
and a warrant case as needing any fine which is  
not a summons case.

Carried.

M A R Rajaram Rao moved to enter  
in column 7 of Schedule II opposite each case  
whether it is a summons or warrant case.

Carried.
